(0:07) Let's see how trees affect the climate of an area.

- (0:10) Our planet's atmosphere traps sunrays to keep us warm, like a greenhouse.
- (0:16) But too many sunrays mean it's too hot.
- (0:19) That's what carbon dioxide does.
- (0:22) Have you noticed in your area that where there are trees, the climate is better?
- (0:27) Trees block sunrays and give a shadow, like an umbrella.
- (0:31) They also reduce temperature through evapotranspiration.
- (0:35) That is when water is absorbed by the roots, travels to the leaves, converts to vapor and cools the area.
- (0:41) They increase air flow through their leaves, too.
- (0:44) So trees help us feel cooler.
- (0:47) Let's protect them!
